STAIRS INTO A STREAM Tom Blake Princess Chambers Basement (entry via Leake St) 2 – 24 Nov (Thur-Sun), 10am-4pm

Fragments of light and looping projections float above a subterranean stream, drawing on the cinematic past of the spaces above and the ways this architecture has been put to use over time.



UNIT (7.1 – 7.13) Local architectural & landscape practices Fremantle Shoreline 2 – 24 Nov, 24/7 FREE

Tracing the Fremantle shoreline at Wallyalup's western edge, UNIT comprises short life architectural and landscape installations on 13 selected waterfront sites within Victoria Quay, Bathers Beach and Fishing Boat Harbour.
